5. Placement of the exhibits will be the responsibility of the Fair Committee.
6. All exhibitors must supply their own display containers.
7. DUE CARE WILL BE TAKEN TO PROTECT EXHIBITS AND CONTAINERS, BUT THE AG. SOCIETY \& FAIR COMMITTEE CANNOT ACCEPT RESPONSIBILTIY FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE.
8. Only judges and authorized persons to be present during judging.
9. Exhibitors MUST be a member of an Agricultural Society. Children under 18 and living at home are covered by membership of either parent (Memberships can be obtained at the time of registration)
10. Category Entry fee: JUNIOR $\$ 3.00$
11. Category Entry Fee: SENIOR, OPEN HANDICRAFT, HOME BAKING, HORTICULTURE, VISUAL ARTS - \$5/category.
12. ENTRIES SUBMITTED MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR. EXHIBITORYS MUST BE AMATEURS. NO COMMERCIAL ENTRIES.
13. Any exhibit winning a prize previously in the Edgerton Ag Fair is NOT eligible for competition.
14. No person will be allowed to enter more than one exhibit in any one class. A single item may be entered in one class only, but a set may be divided among multiple classes.
